






## Day 1: Let's Talk!

Joe thought to himself, They must be with that religious group that's been going from house to house in our neighborhood this week. I sure hope they don't stop here—not now! Don't they know a lot of people are watching the game?

Sure enough, the doorbell rang. Joe was in no mood to be interrupted. "Ellen!" Joe yelled into the kitchen. "Can you get the door? I'm kinda tied up here with this game right now."

Joe heard Ellen's sweet voice greet the couple at the door. He listened with one ear as the couple launched into their well-rehearsed speech. Then he heard his Ellie counter with something out of the Bible. Joe smiled and thought to himself, This is good for Ellen. It's giving her a chance to share some of the things she's learning in that women's Bible study at church.

Joe's attention was immediately drawn back to the game as his favorite team scored a touchdown, He leaped out of his La-Z-Boy recliner and threw his arms upward, signaling a touchdown. Sweet!

4. The Confrontation: Read Genesis 3:1 again. Who did the serpent choose to speak to, and what was his question?

What were the consequences of the serpent's lies and deception (verses 14-15)?

What was another consequence Adam and Eve faced for failing to listen to God's word and obey it (verses 23-24)?

### The Law of E.F. Hutton: Eve Speaks

Remember the old TV commercial? "When E.F. Hutton talks, people listen." Regardless of their titles, real leaders influence others. The story of Eve demonstrates the impact of negative influence. Although God commissioned Adam as her spiritual leader, Eve usurped the role of influencer. Adam followed his wife rather than God, and together they led humankind into sin.<sup>2</sup>

#### Putting It All Together

The perfection of God's creation was disrupted when Satan tempted Adam and Eve to disobey God and usurped His rule over their lives. When they gave in to this temptation—referred to as "the fall"—they damaged their relationship with God and were driven from the garden, away from the original blessing God intended for them. However, even in the midst of this calamity, God had already set in motion His long-term plan to redeem humanity and bring man back into an intimate relationship with Him.<sup>3</sup>

## A Prayer to Pray

In every situation, God's advice is this: "Do not lean on your own understanding." Instead...

Ask God—Read His Word and pray. As you search the Scriptures and pray, God's will is made clearer and clearer. Refuse to make any decisions without first seeking the mind of God through the Bible and prayer.

Ask wise believers—When you have a major decision to make, turn to two or three Christian men, women, or couples whom you can count on to tell it to you like it is. They will most likely see the matter

clearly and give you straight answers. Who can you look to for godly counsel?

Ask your spouse—God has given your husband or wife to you as a sounding board—a helper, a life partner. So seek your partner's input and prayers. Listen carefully. Your decision will affect you both!

### Putting It All Together

David's faith and trust in God brought him to the pinnacle of success. He was the most powerful man in the region, yet lethargy took hold of him. Rather than go out to fight one more battle, he decided to stay in Jerusalem. As he walked on the roof of his palace, he saw Bathsheba bathing below on another rooftop. David then sent for her, committed adultery with her, and tried to hide his sin by murdering Bathsheba's husband, who was one of David's top lieutenants (see 2 Samuel 23:39).

David then married Bathsheba, who was pregnant with their child. One year later, he finally repented. God forgave David, but his moral failure had a devastating effect on his family, starting with the death of his child with Bathsheba. Still, God gave this couple a second chance. Later God chose Solomon, a son of David and Bathsheba, to be David's successor as king. This reminds us that God's grace is poured out upon all who fail and, in repentance, call upon the name of the Lord.<sup>1</sup>

### **A Couple in Crisis**

#### Day 1: Let's Talk!

1. Read this story together and answer the questions addressed to you as a wife or husband.

The highway sign at the crossroad lay in the ditch. There was no way a traveler could spot it. Parked at the unmarked junction and considering their options, Jon and Grace scanned the horizon. There was a solid bank of dark storm clouds in the distance, and the fading sunlight was evidence that night was fast approaching. In despair, they realized with certainty that they were lost. And worse than that, they knew they could even be facing a life-and-death crisis.

"How did this happen?" they asked each other out loud. Here they were, taking a rare cross-country vacation—rare because both Jon and Grace held down stressful, high-responsibility jobs and for at least a year they had been unable to nail down a time off that met with both their employers' approval. And, thank the Lord, it had finally happened! They had looked forward to this time away together for nine months now. Every day they had talked about it, dreamed about what they would see and do, and planned each day's adventures.

Today had been tagged as "Grace's Day." Ever since she was a little girl, she had wanted to see the famous

landscape of alien-looking spires and buttes that stood tall over Monument Valley, which for the most part straddled the Arizona-Utah border in America. Even though she was only 27 years old now, you could say that Monument Valley had been on Grace's "bucket list" ever since her dad had showed her pictures of that scenic wonderland from one of his *National Geographic* magazines.

Jon had done his research. He knew exactly how to get to this lone, remote valley. He had all the information—get off Interstate 40, go up to US 89, then to US 160, then on to US Route 163, which cut through the heart of Monument Valley National Park. No problem there. As Jon planned the journey, he hadn't been sure about Grace's dream of making this desert trek. But wow, he was glad they had done it. The panoramic splendor of Monument Valley had made for a truly breathtaking adventure that they both appreciated.

Where? To whom?

How was this girl described? What greeting was given by the visitor?

The angel said she would have a son. How did he describe the child (verses 31-33)?

Jot down the angel's answer to Mary's question, "How can this be?" (verses 34 and 37).

2. Affirmation from Elizabeth: Scan through Luke 1:36-56. First the angel spoke of another unusual pregnancy. Who was he referring to, and what made this pregnancy so unusual?

What happened when Mary entered Elizabeth's house (verse 41)?

What words did Elizabeth use to affirm Mary's pregnancy?

Scan through Mary's outpouring of praise in verses 46-49. How did Mary describe her relationship with God?

Lists several facts about God that were mentioned by Mary in verses 50-55.

3. Crisis #1, Dream #1: Read Matthew 1:18-25. What was Joseph's Crisis #1, and how did he respond (verses 18-19)?

Note: The reference to "put her away" means to give Mary a bill of divorcement. According to Old Testament customs, Joseph and Mary's betrothal, or engagement, was considered the same as marriage.

What happened to cause Joseph to not follow through with the thought of divorcing Mary (verses 20-21)?

How quickly and decisively did Joseph respond?

What additional information do you learn about Joseph in verse 25?

4. Crisis #2, Dream #2: Read Matthew 2:13-15. What was Crisis #2?

How quickly and decisively did Joseph respond?

#### Putting It All Together

As you piece together the story of Joseph and Mary from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, you quickly realize the significant role Joseph played in the birth and protection of Jesus through a number of serious crises. With the help of God through dreams, Joseph provided strong leadership for Mary and the baby Jesus time and time again. He was a major force for good because he was a man who wanted to do things God's way—a man, a husband, and a father after God's own heart. Initially Joseph wanted to help Mary after finding out about her pregnancy. However, when God clarified to Joseph the reason for Mary's condition, without

any hesitation Joseph took Mary as his wife. He then continued to demonstrate his faith in God as he moved his family around as directed by his dreams. Mary had done her part: She had been obedient as the "maidservant of the Lord." Then she allowed her husband to do his part—to lead her and the Son of God through crisis after crisis.

Even with his high-risk job and all his absences, Barb loves the opportunities that come with David's work. They get to travel to exciting and unusual countries, cities, and cultures, and they especially enjoy meeting new people. Their moves from place to place have been relatively easy because, so far, they haven't had any children. In their hearts they trust that God has His plan and reasons for withholding little ones from them at this time. While they

hope and pray to one day have a rollicking household of kids, they are making the most of their freedom by using their home for their couples' Bible study group from church and, of course, as a hangout for Navy singles.

Barb also loves to cook—"The more the merrier!" is her motto. And the big, burly young sailors love to come over to "Dave and Barb's." They relish kicking back, eating barbecued steaks and burgers—and especially Barb's homemade pie—playing pool, teaming up for video game playoffs, and watching time-delayed sports events on television.

And it never fails: Because everyone knows David and Barb go to church "religiously," eventually talk gets around to church, the Bible, and Jesus. Both David and Barb had determined long ago that the Navy might pay the bills, but their real job—the passion of their hearts—was sharing Christ and the strength and peace and confidence Jesus brings to their lives. The military definitely provides them with an abundance of seeking hearts as prime candidates for the gospel and the love of Jesus. There is just one problem: Occasionally one of David's superiors gives him a less-than-satisfactory job rating because of his strong faith.

- 3. Looking at Teamwork: Read Acts 18:24-28. Describe how Aquila and Priscilla worked as a team to educate Apollos and send him on his way to minister to others.
- 4. *Mentoring a Minister:* Read Acts 18:24-28. Where did Apollos fall short in his understanding and preaching?

What did Aquila and Priscilla do to make it possible to talk with Apollos?

What further assistance did this remarkable husband-wife team give Apollos?

What happened to cause the meeting site to change, and where was the new site (verse 9)?

How long did the Christians meet at this site, and what was the result (verse 10)?

Read this section in your book again. Then read 1 Corinthians 16:19. Where is the church now meeting?

Aquila and Priscilla were a lay couple who quietly went about the business of serving Paul and the church. How does their faithful, humble, behind-the-scenes ministry in Acts 19 encourage you as a couple in your ministry?

6. Using Their Home as a Church in Rome: In time, Aquila and Priscilla moved back to Rome. According to Romans 16:3-5, how do you see Aquila and Priscilla using their home once they returned to Rome?

Paul then left Ephesus and went back to Corinth. Where did Aquila and Priscilla go, according to Romans 16:3-4?

When Paul wrote his letter to the Christians in Rome (the book of Romans), how did he describe...

- ...Aquila and Priscilla?
- ...their ministry to him personally?
- ...the breadth of their ministry?
- ...their present involvement in ministry?
- 7. Serving Where Needed: Let's fast-forward 16 or 17 years in the formation of the early church. Read 2 Timothy 4:19. When Paul wrote to Timothy, whom did he greet, and what does that indicate about their faithfulness?

#### Putting It All Together

Aquila and Priscilla were a remarkable husband-and-wife team. In Scripture, they are always mentioned together. Together, they made tents. Together, they befriended the apostle Paul, who was also a tentmaker. Together, they opened their home to him. And together, they accompanied him on his missionary journeys. Together, their home was always open to others and for church services, no matter where they lived. Together, they were learners who willingly and hungrily sat under Paul's teaching. Together, they passed on what Paul taught them by teaching and talking to others.

Even when it came to danger and courage, Aquila and Priscilla were mentioned together: Together, they risked their lives for Paul. Paul was so deeply grateful for their friendship and partnership in the gospel that, in his letter to the church in Rome, he openly expressed his appreciation for their service. And the last time this couple after God's own heart is mentioned in the Bible, they are mentioned... together.
