THE SEER'S SECRET

It was a family vacation. We had several days of Disney planned, and my kids were looking forward to every moment. I might have been a bit excited as well, but by the end of the first day, after dealing with the terribly long lines, I was exhausted. This vacation started off with enough walking in one day to fill my quota for the entire month. I was grateful but looking forward to some more relaxing time with my family.

The following day we went to the pool. It was a massive resort pool fully equipped with slides, water volleyball, a lazy river, and all sorts water-related fun. While the kids were enjoying the water playground, I was ready to get some sun. We strapped a life jacket on our four-year-old son and let him run around in the shallow kids' pool. We were set. My wife and I were enjoying some vitamin D from the sun. We were finally relaxing together. This was my kind of vacation.

At the time, we were in the middle of a move to a different state so we were thrilled to take some time as a family to regroup and make some wonderful memories together. In the middle of this transition, the Holy Spirit spoke to me, and He said something that went very deep in my spirit: "I am going to make miracles in your move." This was an exciting time of transition, and we were looking for the Holy Spirit to breathe life onto our recent move.

While laying out in the sun thinking about the recent events leading up to this moment, I found myself mindful of the goodness of God. Taking in this moment of gratefulness, I could sense God's presence all around. The peace I was experiencing was oxygen to my soul. Lost in the moment, I was oblivious to everything around me and in a special place of connection to

Jesus. It was then that my wife tapped me on the foot and brought me back to an awareness of my surroundings. She spoke my name as I came to. I felt like I was awakening from sleep.

“Jamie, get up. A four-year-old boy drowned.”

“What?” I asked.

“I don’t really know,” she replied in a panic, “but there is a group of people trying to revive this boy on the other side of the pool.”

I immediately got up and ran to see what was happening. Looking back, I could see my wife holding our four-year-old son in her arms and comforting our daughter. When I came to the area where they had the boy, the pool lifeguard was attempting CPR on him, trying to revive him the best he could. The mother was screaming and crying with the most desperate sound I have ever heard. People standing by were talking quietly about how the boy had been found by his five-year-old cousin floating at the bottom of the lazy river.

The utter helplessness in the atmosphere was so thick; the only thing cutting through it was the sound of this mother crying for her child. I stood by with my father-in-law, praying in my spirit, “Do something, God. Please, do something.”

Twenty minutes or so went by, and this boy still lay there unconscious and barely breathing. The CPR was not changing anything. Some were suggesting that the might have food stuck in his airway and were loudly encouraging the boy to throw up. Others were saying he possibly hit his head and fell unconscious into the pool.

The resort paramedic was now trying to pump his lungs and remove any water he may have swallowed. Nothing was changing, and the boy was looking worse. His breathing was sporadic, and you could see this boy was fighting for his life.

It might have been 10 to 15 minutes later when the ambulance finally arrived. The EMT placed the boy on a stretcher and marched him off to the medical vehicle. The only sound you could hear in the whole resort was the sound of the mother wailing for her son's life. This four-year-old boy was now being hauled off in what felt like a funeral procession. People were trying to comfort the mother, but everyone there felt the darkness of what was happening to this family. I followed along, still praying, "Do something, God. Do something." I remember my thoughts as I tried to rationalize the situation. *At best, this boy is going to have severe brain damage*, I thought.

As they rushed him into the ambulance, the mother still sobbing in despair, I continued to pray, "Do something, God. Do something." It was in that moment that I heard the Holy Spirit speak so clearly to my gut: "You do something." It was like something exploded in my spirit. I was determined to see this boy come back to us and fulfill his God-given destiny. My wife and I ran up to the mother, who was hysterical, and grabbed her hand. I could feel the desperation, and I spoke to her, "I am a healing minister. May I pray for your son?"

She yelled out, "Please, he's my only son!"

"What is his name?" I asked.

"Adam," she cried.

Emily, my wife, took one hand, and I took the other, and I spoke to the mother, "God is going to bring Adam back to us, and he is going to fulfill his destiny."

In that moment, I felt an intense shout rise out of my soul as I called out, "Adam, I speak to your spirit: Come back into your body! Holding my son in my arms and holding my daughter's hand, I spoke to my wife without words. Our immense gratefulness for what God had just done was now pouring into our family. We were in awe. While we strapped our kids in, my wife and I kept making eye contact with each other and shaking our heads in astonishment.

I went around to the front door of the driver's side and looked up to find a man standing still beside a white van, staring at me. I had not seen this man before, but he looked at me and spoke my name like he knew me.

"Jamie," he said.

"Yes?" I replied.

"Is the boy okay?"

"What happened to the boy?" you ask. As we drove away, we could see the helicopter airlifting him to the nearest major hospital. He was being rushed there to see if any brain damage had occurred during his time of unconsciousness. A couple days later, Emily was walking around the resort and recognized one of the faces of the family. It was the boy's uncle, and he was taking a group of kids out for some fun.

My wife introduced herself and asked about the boy. The uncle responded with incredible news: Adam was just fine, healthy, and not a single bit of brain damage was found! Not only that, but he wanted to go back to the pool! My wife was shocked. The boy's uncle continued to tell her that Adam could not recall the incident; his only memory was that he had been in a special place where he could breathe underwater. I believe Adam was in the Spirit with the presence of God.

It is moments like this—otherworldly moments—that have captured my attention. There is another reality where angels, miracles, and the supernatural are being orchestrated by the Lord of Hosts to bring the Kingdom of Heaven to earth and to reveal the goodness of God. This invisible world is actively hidden right in front of our eyes. Every day there are supernatural moments that are so covert they might be missed unless we have eyes to see them.

Personally, I am curious and want to know more. I want to see the invisible activities of Heaven. Are there ways to peer into these hidden realities? Can we recognize both the obvious actions and the subtleties of God? I believe so, and it is a passion of mine to discover the ways of God and to see past the realm of the natural into the realm of the supernatural. Perhaps God is looking for those who will try to find what He is hiding in plain sight!

It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, but the glory of kings is to search out a matter (Proverbs 25:2).

Made You Look

But why don't more people experience this unseen reality? If it is that powerful—enough to influence the world in which we live—why is it not taught in schools or referenced in common conversation? If we can see its influence, why is it sort of looked down upon in some social and church circles to talk about it? I think it all comes down to this one thing: Are

people looking and paying attention to it, or are we trained to ignore what is right in front of our noses?

When I was a kid, I played a game called “Made you look.” In the game, we would make the person look at something by pointing out something passing by. This was often a game that we would play on long road trips in the car to keep us amused. We would say something like, “Look at that tree over there!” The other person would quickly turn their head and look. At that point, we would say, “Made you look!” No matter how many times we did this, it always seemed fun and new. “Made you look” became one of our favorite games on the road. The things that we would make someone look at were always there. The difference is, they normally weren’t paying enough attention to focus and look at them. There is an unseen world right in front of our eyes. We may not see it because we do not look.

While we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal (2 Corinthians 4:18).

When we focus in on something, we begin to connect with it. There is a difference between seeing and looking. Seeing happens to a person; looking is the action the individual takes even before they see it. In this book, I want to help you know what to look for! Everyone has the eyes to see, but not all look. What are we looking for? We’re looking for things that are not seen! Things around us are temporary. Temporary things fade away, but the Kingdom of God lasts forever. Imagine a world where color is so much brighter—a bustling world full of movement and daily activity. In the created world, we are all being impacted and influenced by a culture outside of the natural realm. When we live in the natural world without this knowledge, we do not consider the effect that the invisible realm has on our visible day.

What if I told you that there was another reality that has a direct impact on the world in which you live? What if I told you that this world, this reality, could not help but be influenced by a coinciding alternate reality? Now by “alternate” I do not mean the opposite. This alternate reality directly occurs

simultaneously with the world that we live in right now. If I told you that there were invisible advantages you could access at any given moment, would you want to know about them? Of course you would! But what if I told you that there are invisible disadvantages being played out in your life? Some of these disadvantages you might be aware of, and some of them you may not. These disadvantages may play against you in everyday situations. But what are these advantages and disadvantages?

Divine Appointment

The truth is, the number of invisible realities in a normal day would totally blow us away. We may not realize it, but an average day has hidden and invisible mechanics happening at every turn. Getting to work on time, getting delayed, a chance meeting with that certain someone, the dog pulling you in a new direction—these events may seem all too normal, but there are very few, if any, random happenings in our day. Each and every day, a divine selection of events occurs, appointments and disappointments that change the course of history in our life one moment at a time.

An appointment is a convergence of two or more things at a particular place and time. When these things come together, we experience an appointment. When God sets something up and we meet someone or find something somewhere, we have what I call a “divine appointment”—a moment appointed by the Spirit of God where destiny meets reality and invisible worlds become visible.

In this convergence of life, we experience a moment with God, but we may not realize it. We may have been led to think this is luck, but what if it is something more? And if there is something more going on, can I as a believer become more intentional about noticing these moments? Is it even possible to step into these moments more often?

There are invisible problems happening around us as well. While God is constantly setting up divine appointments, we can also experience what the

enemy is trying to set up. The enemy wants to disappoint us from our divine appointment.

The enemy is constantly trying to dismantle our divine appointment. God means for good and the enemy for evil. So now we are faced with an invisible reality. What do I do about this? What can I do about this? The normal life in Jesus is designed to be an increasing string of divine appointments. The secret to a life filled with divine appointments is hidden in plain sight. When we understand this secret, it's a game changer!

The Secret Things

The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but those things which are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law (Deuteronomy 29:29).

Have you ever met someone who has a really difficult time keeping secrets? Maybe you know someone who seems to be overly excited to tell you something secret. There are certain things that God keeps secret, but then there are other things that He loves to reveal. Secrets are the wonder of God. He may not be the author of confusion, but make no mistake—He is a God of mystery and secrecy. God knows things, and He knows what we do not know. He takes those things that we do not know and prepares them for a great reveal. In doing so, He invites us into a mysterious encounter with His secrets.

We may think of property as something material someone has in their possession. It could be a house, a piece of land, a car, or a boat. While material possessions can be passed down from one generation to another, so can spiritual secrets. The things that are revealed were once hidden things. These things may have been there the whole time, hidden in plain sight, but once they are revealed they belong to those to whom they have been entrusted. Like the passing of property from one generation to another, God is raising up a generation to which He can reveal His mysteries. This

generation will be called to steward the greatest secrets of all time. What mysteries and wonders wait for those who are willing to go beyond the veil and peer past the seen into the unseen? Where are those whom God can trust with these secrets? Who are they, and what do they look like?

Seers shared things with the people of the day. Perhaps they shared the mysteries of God! We do know for sure that they shared the secrets of what the future held. It seemed to be customary that when visiting the seer, one would bring some food as a sort of offering (see 1 Samuel 9:7). The locals knew about the seer, as evidenced by the fact that the soon-to-be king, Saul, asks some of the locals on his journey, “*Is the seer here?*” (1 Samuel 9:11). They seem to casually respond about his whereabouts, sending Saul on his way to meet the seer. Saul stumbles into a divine appointment with the one he is looking for and asks him, “Please tell me, where is the seer’s house?” (1 Samuel 9:18). Then “*Samuel answered Saul and said, ‘I am the seer. Go up before me to the high place, for you shall eat with me today; and tomorrow I will let you go and will tell you all that is in your heart’*” (1 Samuel 9:19).

Seer

Verb: Hebrew. רָאָה ra’ah
: to see, perceive, have vision.¹

Samuel was a seer of the highest accuracy. He could tell you the secrets of your heart, the things that no one else knew. His sight was beyond the natural into the invisible realities of the heart. Just as Adam could see the invisible qualities of each animal, Samuel the seer had vision to see what no one else did. Saul did not realize it that day, but his chance encounter with the seer was a divine appointment. Heaven was inviting him to the seer’s house to hear the secrets only Heaven knew. This same invitation comes to us today. God invites us to see the world around us with a different set of eyes. With this in mind, I invite you into Secrets of the Seer.

THE SECRET OF ABUNDANCE

Warning: This mystery is not a get-rich-quick scheme or a teaching on how God wants you to be rich. This mystery is not about money but about a lifestyle of abundance. I encourage the reader to keep an open mind, as God “*is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us*” (Ephesians 3:20).

And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work. —2 Corinthians 9:8

During my time as a pastor, a wonderful woman within our community came to me to tell me a story. She and her husband had been praying for God to bless her and give her a significant financial increase so that they could pay off some debt that they had, give where they wanted to, and on top of all this be blessed to take some time on a much-needed vacation. During this time, she and her husband were going through their house, getting rid of random things that were taking up space. There was a collection of art hanging in one corner of the room, all from the same artist. Some of the collection was unframed, as her husband had been given most of it as a gift for some work he had done in the past. A couple of the pieces he had paid \$100 for, but for the most part the rest had been given as gifts. Unaware of how much they were worth, they kept them loosely arranged in a pile on the floor, some positioned upright between the wall and the floor.

While cleaning house, she and her husband thought they should see if any of them had any value and put one of them up for auction online. They found a live auction website for art—sort of like an eBay for fine art—and placed it there at a beginning bid of a dollar. As time went on, over a course of days they came back to see the current bid of the auction. To their shock, the current bid was roughly around \$10,000! It did not stop there. The auction was only halfway through, and within a couple days the final bid came in at \$32,500. Ecstatic, she told me, “Jamie, we have a bunch of these just laying around the house—all from the same artist!” My encouragement to her was, “Make sure you pick the rest up off the floor!”

This fantastic story highlights the ninth secret of the seer—*the secret of abundance*. Who knows for how long these wonderful folks walked past these pieces of fine art and saw them lying on the floor but did not truly see their real value. This is the secret of abundance: the ability to see the world around you—not just the invisible, but what is already visible, with eyes that truly see.

Hidden in Plain Sight

The seer does not see only the spiritual realities, the realm of angels and demons and visions and dreams. The seer has eyes to see what is hidden in plain sight in the physical world around us. Things that others might call common, the seer sees value in—value that is not staring everyone in the face but is hidden in such a way that it takes a trained eye to see its promise and potential.

Jesus took His disciples on a little journey to show them the Kingdom. In broad daylight, He took a few small fish and seven loaves of bread and did something even the disciples could not perceive.

So He commanded the multitude to sit down on the ground. And He took the seven loaves and gave thanks, broke them and gave them to His disciples to set before them; and they set them before the multitude. They also had a few

small fish; and having blessed them, He said to set them also before them. So they ate and were filled, and they took up seven large baskets of leftover fragments. Now those who had eaten were about four thousand. And He sent them away (Mark 8:6-9).

With the multitude all around and the disciples at His side, Jesus multiplies the loaves and fish and creates such a feast out of something so small that they need to collect the remains as leftover pieces and put them in seven large baskets. His disciples are fed, and so is everyone else.

When they leave that place, they set sail in a boat and the most bizarre thing happens to Jesus. The religious rulers of the day, known as Pharisees, come out, “*seeking from Him a sign from heaven, testing Him*” (Mark 8:11). The wild thing to me is that Jesus had just done a sign. The problem is, they wanted a spiritual sign, but Jesus just did a natural sign. They wanted some kind of heavenly light show or maybe something more spiritual, but Jesus gave the sign of the multiplication of something earthly and natural—physical food. The problem is, they had become so spiritual that they couldn’t see the physical resource right in front of them. Jesus gets into the boat again, and another interesting thing happens:

Now the disciples had forgotten to take bread, and they did not have more than one loaf with them in the boat (Mark 8:14).

When I was a kid, my father would make bread on Saturdays at our house. All the way upstairs you could smell the bread being prepared. The smells were intoxicating. I joke that there is a reason Jesus was tempted by the devil with gluten. My brothers and I were all thinking the same thing: That bread is all mine! My dad grew up in an Italian home so bread was traditionally served with a dipping plate of olive oil and cracked black pepper over the top, with Pecorino Romano cheese. When you took a slice of that bread and dipped it into the olive oil, it was heavenly. My brothers and I all had the same thing on our mind: *Who was going to eat the bread first, and how many slices were we each going to get?* Our minds could not be distracted; our eyes were fixed on that bread. If so much as a single slice went missing, someone better have had some answers. Can you imagine the

disciples sitting there in the boat with one loaf of bread between 13 grown men—one Jesus and twelve disciples? Everyone in that boat would have known where that one loaf was! Jesus was aware of the tension, and He used a physical symbol to illustrate a spiritual problem.

Then He charged them saying, “Take heed, beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of Herod.” And they reasoned among themselves, saying, “It is because we have no bread” (Mark 8:15-16).

How did they go from one loaf of bread to no loaf of bread? Where did the bread go? It was there one moment and suddenly it is gone? If one of them had eaten the loaf, surely Peter would have had something to say about it.

But Jesus, being aware of it, said to them, “Why do you reason because you have no bread? Do you not yet perceive nor understand? Is your heart still hardened? Having eyes, do you not see? And having ears, do you not hear? And do you not remember?” (Mark 8:17-18)

Jesus knows about the loaf. It is as if they cannot see the loaf hidden in plain sight. Something very spiritual is happening, and it is blocking the disciples’ ability to see and hear. Why can they not see the loaf right in front of them? Where did it go? Jesus warns the disciples about “*the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of Herod*” (Mark 8:15). Remember the Pharisees and how spiritual they had become, but they couldn’t even recognize the abundance right in front of their eyes? Jesus was working miracles all the time, but the Pharisees still could not see it. It was as if a blindness had taken over their spirits. Jesus warns about this blindness. He even mentions Herod as well—the blindness of the leaven of Herod. “*Having eyes, do you not see? And having ears, do you not hear?*” (Mark 8:18). Herod wanted to see a miracle done by Jesus as well, but Herod was just like the Pharisees (see Luke 23:8). With a “*heart still hardened,*” he avoided any transformation to the state of his heart (Mark 8:17).

The warning to beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Herod is still just as important to us today. This type of thinking darkens our eyes and ears and keeps us from seeing abundance in the world around us. Just like the

disciples, instead of a loaf of bread we see lack. Instead of the abundance of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, we cannot fully see what He has already done for us.

“When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many baskets full of fragments did you take up?” They said to Him, “Twelve.” “Also, when I broke the seven for the four thousand, how many large baskets full of fragments did you take up?” And they said, “Seven.” So He said to them, “How is it you do not understand?” (Mark 8:19-21)

Jesus asks them to take an audit of what is around them, what they witnessed with their eyes. In the same way, are you aware of the abundance that is around you?

It is amazing to me just how much we have that we cannot see. The secret of abundance gives us eyes to see the generosity of God in everyday life. It helps us to see that piece of art on the floor for its real value. It helps us to see that person in front of us on the train as a child of God and not just another passenger. It helps us to see the abundance that God is providing for us every day that may go unnoticed.

Fasting has become a way that I step into the secret of abundance. I am not fasting for things; rather, if I do fast, it is to gain clarity to see what I already have been given. It is to get eyes to see and ears to hear, along with a heart to understand. It amazes me how little food I think I have in my pantry, but as soon as I begin the fast I start seeing the incredible four-course meal waiting for me at the end of it. Suddenly, I am finding things in my fridge that I had no idea were there. The secret of abundance takes over, and I am given eyes to see what was hidden in plain sight.

True Value

The secret of abundance gives us the ability to see true value in something. It is that perception that sees that the handcrafted wallet created by the

street vendor in Mexico is worth more than the one in the glass case down the road at the nearest high-end department store. When we see the world through this lens, we can discern abundance. I believe Jesus walked in the secret of abundance. He was able to identify true value when the woman gave an offering that was far below what everyone else gave. It was so valuable because she gave out of her lack, while others gave out of their surplus.

Keys to Unlocking This Secret

Sow where you grow. Like any investor, gardener, or even farmer, sow where you know there is maximum growth. *“Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you”* (Luke 6:38). Unlocking abundance first begins with living a generous life. Yet even generosity is smart enough to discern what is a good place to give and what is not. Imagine God has given you a banana tree. Your responsibility is now to use the secret of abundance and maximize where this plant will thrive. Would you ever try to plant the banana tree in the desert? I don’t think so. You are going to look for the right conditions: the perfect soil, the right sunlight, and the best amount of rain for a plant like that. In the same way, give your time, energy, and resources to something you know is going to give you great return on your investment.

Make wise purchases.

She considers a field and buys it; from her profits she plants a vineyard (Proverbs 31:16).

Pay personal attention to where and what you spend your resources on. The secret of abundance bears the fruit of assets, while the destruction of

poverty carries the burden of liability. Everyone is going to spend money, but what are you spending yours on? Is it bringing greater freedom in your life or greater hassle? Do your homework and research the best options. This gives you the ability to discover true value and grow in the secret of abundance.

Perceive potential.

She perceives that her merchandise is good, and her lamp does not go out by night (Proverbs 31:18).

If you do not understand the value of what you have, someone else will make that determination for you, and it may not be abundance. Moses had an old staff made out of wood, and God told him it was enough to deliver His people out of slavery. Have you perceived the value of what is in your possession? Ask God to give you eyes to see the potential of the things you have been given.
